

EASTERN BYPASS STUDY PROBLEM STATEMENT

“The problems to be addressed by a new transportation facility within the study area include: increased current and future transportation demands; limited regional multimodal access, mobility, and travel efficiency; diminished safety and increased costs with the existing transportation network; and limited support for planned economic growth.”

Projects such as the Eastern Bypass are developed to achieve certain purposes, such as solving problems of restricted mobility or diminishing safety. Often, however, there are other problems in a community or region that the project could also solve or help address.

Members of the community themselves are the best source of this information, and the CAG has been very helpful in developing the official statement of the problems that the Eastern Bypass could solve or help address.
